We geared up and headed into the water that was flat enough to get in a good water ski run. Visibility was clearly (no pun intended) great as we swam out, As soon as we dropped down we came upon a lion's mane nudibranch (aka Hooded Nudibranch) hanging out on some eel grass. As we continued down the slope, Kim and Steve spotted a couple of rat fish but missed the washing machine drums. We located the rope trail at about 60 feet, and with little current, decided to go to the right. Along the trail there were plenty of clumps of rocks, plastic spheres, old crab traps and some toilets. Amongst the critters spotted were alabaster nudibranchs, Monterey Dorids, striped nudibranchs, flounder, buffalo sculpin, perch and a Snyder's blade shrimp. One of the more interesting sights was an alabaster nudibranch with what appeared to be a worm wrapped around it. It was a really good dive, followed by some really good pizza.


