Our January meeting agenda includes planning our April club dive and selecting an Edmonds restaurant for our after-meeting repast.

January Club Dive - Saltwater SP

We selected a south Sound location for our first dive of the New Year. We will meet at **Saltwater State Park** in Des Moines at **10:00 AM on Sunday, January 18**. Bring your power fins for the seemingly never-ending surface swim to reach the artificial reef at this site. The reef provides habitat for a variety of marine life, including large ling cod, lots of rock fish, and lots of nudibranchs. Be sure to bring your **Washington Discover Pass** or be prepared to buy a day pass at the park. After the dive we will head further south to Mama Stortini's for lunch.

Directions to Saltwater State Park:

From the North:

Go S on I-5 to Exit 149 and go West on SR516
In about 2 miles, go South on Marine View Drive
The park will be about a mile down the road on your right. Once in the park, drive down to the water and park close to the shore.

From the South:

Go N on I-5 to Exit 147 and go West on S 272nd St.
After about a mile, turn right on 16th Ave S. Go N for about 1.25 mi and turn left on S 250th St.
In about 0.5 mi turn left on Marine View Drive and enter the park on your right.
You can also enter **Saltwater Underwater Park** into Google Maps for directions.

Possibly the most interesting was a sailfin sculpin that was coiled up on the bottom playing dead. Joe watched it swim to a spot and coil up. Bart then happened upon it and could not tell if it was alive or dead. Later on there was another sailfin sculpin acting normal, whatever that is. We also saw a number of hairy crabs, two really nice frosted nudibranchs, a nice ling cod, a school of tube snouts and more shrimp then you could shake a stick at. Visibility was at least 25 feet and there was no current at all on the dive.

December Bonus Dive Report

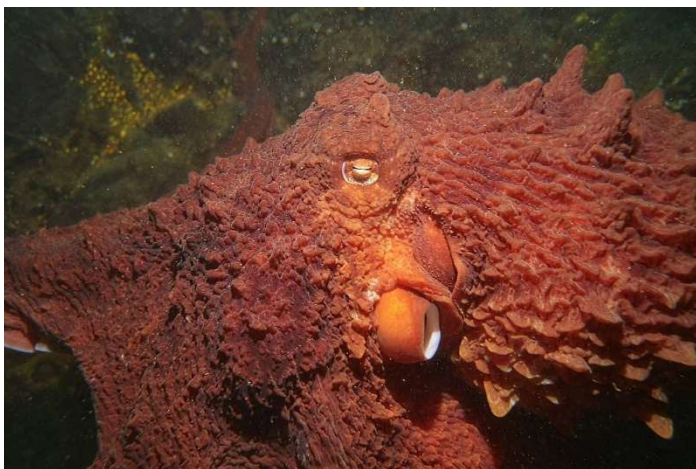
It was quite cold but very sunny for the Club December Bonus Dive at Redondo. The tide was in, nearly to the base of the Aquarium. There was a No
